Pledge Best Practices For Societies

(wie.ieee.org/wie-pledge)



- 1. Informing all the society chapters about what is the IEEE WIE pledge and what it implies.
- 2. Defining a path that can help society representatives to reach out to the IEEE WIE Society for the sake of supporting the IEEE WIE pledge.
- **3. Creating opportunities of exposure**, such as reference learning material.
- 4. Improving the awareness of what IEEE WIE is and how to apply the pledge in your society within the IEEE WIE Society committee
- 5. Working towards integrating the pledge formally into the documents that regulate the activities Promoting the IEEE WIE pledge in all the Technical Committees.
- 6. Generating outreach, mentoring programs, technical sessions, promoting and sustaining diverse representation in the committee's leadership within the society.
- 7. Including the IEEE WIE pledge in all the membership level events, i.e., since members are students in their events and proposals.
- 8. Improving websites and social media publicity
- 9. Having IEEE WIE Society representation during the smaller society events, not only in flagship events



Membership Development in Societies

2- Current Membership development activities and strategies:

These activities are being held by the societies, helping to increase and maintain membership.

- Writing women-pieces for newsletter and magazines
- Reporting WIE activities, women and DEI events at flagship conferences.
- Workshops/Event meetings (mostly for students and young professionals) at prominent conferences with student travel support scholarships.
- Women's lunch and speakers at conferences
- Providing readout of WiE meetings, resources and initiatives, Supporting D&I committees
- DV webinars
- Bringing awareness to IEEE WIE Activities
- Advertising WIE programs in members LinkedIn groups and Promoting participation in WIE events and activities
- Organizing dedicated panel discussions at societies flagship conferences
- Collaboration with Young Professionals
- Virtual / in person networking events and mentoring sessions. Diffusion as: articles, blog, live
 Events, webinars, newsletters, virtual sessions



Membership Development in Societies (3. Part 1)

3- Benefits of WIE and Societies from their membership development activities:

These are the identified benefits of having the possibility to share activities for membership development.

- Access to endless personal and technical growth resources
- Support to overcome barriers faced by women researchers
- Increase female participation, Grow society membership
- New ideas & initiatives
- Professional visibility
- Opportunities for leadership positions
- Serving on editorial boards and conference programs
- Spread the information about WIE related activities
- Access to more resources for all the events society plans
- Belong to a society that is itself a role model of good gender practices, plus all the technical benefits





Membership Development in Societies (3. Part 2)

3- Benefits of WIE and Societies from their membership development activities:

- All WIE can be WICE members automatically without any fee (COMSOC).
- Inspire and motivate both students and young professionals to have efficient roles in their professions, by meeting successful female engineers and professors.
- Share experiences and expertise on outreach programs
- Community of interest
- Collaboration on society initiatives
- Support for women researchers





Membership Development in Societies

4- Strategies that can be made between WIE and societies:

Many of these strategies have been done as seen before, but it would be important to focus on a list of specific activities to create a guide for liaisons.

- Organizing WIE panels at professional society conferences
- Meetings at IEEE events
- Define more clear goals and outreach efforts to offload work to societies.
- Advertise in allied conferences
- Doing joint events in order to get more support from IEEE.
- Identifying common goals and purposes
- Defining a focus area between WIE and societies as diversity and inclusion
- Professional development events; younger students (e.g., high school) outreach events
- Fund/support from WIE one from each society (or rotate among the societies) for members
- Joint panels, networking events and mentorship programs
